

Radiologist joins Headwaters staff

Headwaters Health Care Centre announced Wednesday that radiologist Dr. Michael Stefanos has joined the hospital's Department of Diagnostic Imaging.

"Dr. Stefanos is a valuable addition to our Diagnostic Imaging Department," said Headwaters chief of staff Dr. Jeff McKinnon. "His experience and skill level will enhance the services we are able to deliver to our community."

Dr. Stefanos completed his residency and fellowship at the University of Toronto and is Royal

College and American Board Certified in Diagnostic Radiology. He is as Fellowship trained in Women's Imaging at the University of Toronto at University Health Network and Mount Sinai Hospital in Toronto. He joins Headwaters after holding successful clinical positions at Credit Valley Hospital and Humber River Regional Hospital's radiology departments.

Dr. Stefanos' clinical specialties include diagnostic breast imaging including mammography, MRI and Ultrasounds, as well as percutaneous proce-

dures, including MRI, ultrasound and stereotactic guided breast biopsies, and performing obstetrical imaging.

"Headwaters recently opened our digital mammography room in November 2008 and in 2009 will be adding a 64-slice CT scan and nuclear medicine capabilities to expand our diagnostic imaging services," said Scott Edmonstone, Manager of Diagnostic Imaging at Headwaters.

"The nuclear medicine program will enable non-invasive cardiac assessment and allow us to take images of particular organ systems such as the brain,

kidneys, heart, gallbladder, lungs and thyroid gland.

He said the hospital's team of radiologists and technologists "will allow us to provide the best service possible to our community."

An experienced researcher, Dr. Stefanos has been involved in a variety of research projects including work on MRI in the surveillance of women with prior history of breast cancer which was presented at an international radiology conference.

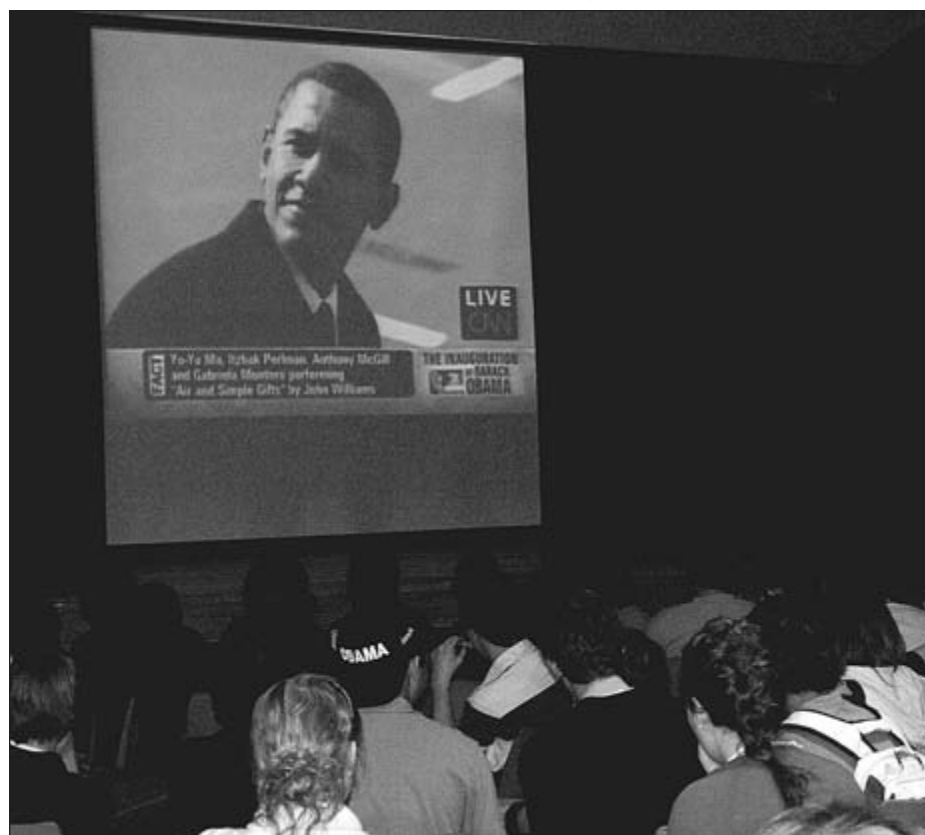
"Dr. Stefanos is an integral part of our multi-disciplinary approach to providing comprehensive

Crisis support volunteers sought

Caledon/Dufferin Victim Services, a crisis response service, is recruiting community volunteers for the annual spring training to be offered in April and May.

The agency provides the "train the trainer" education enabling community volunteers to provide the front line, 24 hour on-call service to residents of, or those affected by, crime and tragedy in the Town of Caledon and the County of Dufferin.

Approximately 55 Crisis Support Volunteers work closely with police and other emergency services, providing short-term emotional support, practical assistance, telephone follow-up contact and information.

In 2008, our staff and

crisis support volunteers responded to more than 1900 calls for service following such occurrences as domestic violence, personal/family crisis, serious motor vehicle collisions and fatalities, property crimes and industrial accidents.

Potential crisis support volunteers are screened and interviewed. Applicants must be able to cope under duress in crisis situations and demonstrate strong communication skills. Prospective candidates must be at least 23 years of age, possess a valid driver's license, maintain appropriate auto insurance and have access to a vehicle. Applicants are required to consent to a release of information giving police the authority to obtain a clear criminal record check. Twenty-five applicants will be selected and offered the opportunity to participate in agency training.

The mandatory 40 hours of training takes place over a two and a half week period, during evening hours and on one Saturday.

Interesting training topics include crisis intervention, domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, property crimes, effective communication skills, grief and bereavement, large scale community response, mental health and volunteer safety.

Nostalgic film based in summer of '69

The Monday Night at the Movies film to be screened next Monday at Orangeville's Galaxy Cinema is a Canadian production, "A No-Hit No-Run Summer" (Un Été Sans Point ni Coup Sûr).

The film looks back lovingly and longingly on the loss of childhood innocence. It's the summer of 1969 and a wave of optimism engulfs the western world.

Twelve-year-old Martin

(Pier-Luc Funk) yearns to become a baseball whiz, and eagerly watches every Expos game he can. Alas, when the hotshot local coach (Roy Dupuis) holds tryouts, Martin does not make the cut. His father Charles (Patrice Robitaille), however, has a plan.

He starts up a separate team for all of those kids who need to find another route to the big league. After the initial euphoria, Martin realizes that his team's biggest talent lies in finding new ways to lose and that his father doesn't know a thing about baseball, 12-year old boys or even his own son.

Director Francis Leclerc's heartfelt drama works so well because the filmmaker maintains control of a perfect tone. Although nostalgic, it is never maudlin, capturing the moment between

childhood and adulthood with tremendous precision.

Charles's lack of baseball knowledge provides some of the humour, but this is not the whole point; it is his love for his son that drives him to create the oddball league. Sports fans will appreciate the baseball, while Dupuis devotees will have yet another chance to see the actor stretch himself into a new and unexpected role as the nasty, competitive coach.

Rated G, the film runs 104 minutes and will have three screenings, at 4:30, 7 and 9:20 p.m. Individual tickets are available (\$8 cash only) at BookLore and Galaxy (Monday night only).
