

Northmen A's add three more to win column

The Rayburn Construction Northmen continue to solidify their position atop the OLA Junior A standings, winning all three of their games this past weekend by scores of 13-10, 14-4 and 8-4 over Burlington, Barrie and Whitby respectively.

On Saturday night it was a battle for first place as the Burlington Chiefs took up residence in the visitors bench at the Tony Rose Memorial Sports Complex.

Trailing Orangeville by two points heading into the game, Burlington was

not about to let the Northmen have this one without a fight.

After falling behind 4-2 in the first, the Chiefs played even with Orangeville through the second and gave them pause for thought scoring three unanswered goals over 23 seconds late in the third before Nick Rose closed the back door for good to hold on to the 13-10 decision.

Again, Adam Jones lead the way for Orangeville with six goals and one assist while Sean Gillies and Andrew Suitor each contributed a pair

capped of by singles from Greg Harnett, Jeremy Noble and Craig England.

Sunday night, the Barrie Lakeshores made the trip to town for the second meeting of these two teams this season.

As in their first outing, Orangeville dominated the play, getting out to a 7-2 lead by the end of the first.

Dillon Ward was again solid in this his fourth start of the season, allowing only two more Lakeshores goals over the final forty minutes of play while Orangeville counted seven more to make it 14-4 at the buzzer.

Deron Dempster joined with Jones in tagging two on the night while ten others including Suitor, England, Jordan Critch, Jessie Gamble, John Quarrie, Mike Teete, the Gillies' - Sean and Brad and Noble's - Jeremy and Jason each contributed singles in the effort.

Tuesday found the team on the road in Whitby where again they rose to the challenge with Ward answering the call yet again in net.

Down 3-1 after one, Whitby kept it close outscoring Orangeville in the second only to have the Northmen rally for three unanswered goals in the third to double up 8-4 over the Warriors at the final buzzer.

Critch, Teeter, Jeremy Noble and Glen Bryan made it onto the score sheet with one apiece while Jones and Mat McLeod each tallied for two goals and two assists in this the 14th win of the season for Orangeville.

Action resumes this weekend when Kitchener-Waterloo comes to town for the first meeting of the two clubs this season on Friday then its a rematch with the Chiefs in Burlington on Monday night with the opening draw schedule for 8 p.m. both nights.

a hard fought game and thought his team really deserved better but in his words, "the ball just wasn't rolling our way."
