## Success for Caledon swimmer

The third time was the charm for 15 year old Jane Scognamiglio on Saturday as the Caledon resident officially became the youngest person to successfully swim across Lake Ontario.

Postponing her attempt twice in the week before, Scognamiglio finally stepped into the lake at 9:33 p.m Friday night to begin the 52 km crossing. After a night of battling wind, waves and

currents, she swam on through the day until at 5:32 p.m on Saturday afternoon she touched the shore at Marilyn Bell Park on the waterfront to officially complete the record breaking crossing in a time of 19 hours, 59 minutes and 49 seconds.

In a posting on her Facebook page the next day, she said, "It was a tough swim with several challenges but somehow managed to pull through and finish."

This is the third long distance swim record for Scognamiglio. In 2008 she set the mark for both youngest and fastest swim across Lake Erie as well.
