

Terry Fox Run set for Sept. 13

The 29th Annual Terry Fox Run for Cancer Research will take place in Orangeville on Sunday, September 13.

Last year's 145 participants raised \$10,784. This was done with the assistance of many volunteers

and the support from Watermaker, Zehrs, Metro, Sobey's, Price Chopper, No Fills, Dods & McNair and Orangeville Window and Doors.

Once again, residents in the Orangeville area will have an opportunity to

participate with others around the world in the Terry Fox Run.

The Orangeville Run site will be the same as in past years, with the start and finish being Tony Rose Memorial Sports Complex. The course is

open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. There will be a 10 km and a 5 km route which are accessible to runners, walkers, cyclists, in-line skaters and wheelchairs.

Limited numbers of the 2009 t-shirts will be available at the Run. The cost is

\$17 for adult sizes and \$15 for children's sizes.

Pledge forms are available at several locations including: Scotiabank, TD-Canada Trust branches, Bank of Montreal, LCBO, grocery stores, Watermaker, BookLore, Moccaberry, medical offices, Sanderson Sports and Esso gas stations.

A first-ever fundraiser for Dufferin County, The Walk for Suicide Awareness and Prevention will run from 6 to 9 p.m. starting in Alexandra Park, behind Orangeville's Town Hall. This event will fea-

ture an opening ceremony with local dignitaries and spokespersons starting at 6 p.m.

The walk route will take you from the park west up Broadway. Throughout the evening, participants can enjoy a free concert with local talent "Justin MacDonald Band" and "Darling Ouisseaux's" in the park gazebo, children's

activities, Pizza Pizza will be on site to offer food and beverages, community resource groups will be present to educate the public about resources in Dufferin county and a candlelight vigil will take place during the walk in memory of those we have lost to suicide.

All are welcome. The event will start at 6, with the walk commencing at 6:30pm. Please first register at the information booth in Alexandra Park. Music and activities will continue throughout the event.

Suicide rates across the world and in our own community at this time are likely to be impacted by not only life's daily pressures but the unexpected current economic changes.

Of those, 97% favoured an extension to next June, and two-thirds would offer donations of \$625 per child, plus "67.7% would keep children enrolled if extension was granted which accounts for 36 children," a reduction from the previously reported 75.

The parents admit the survey was incomplete but point to the relatively brief time they were given to come up with a satisfactory business plan.

It is the brief notice combined with the hospi-

tal's apparent intention to convert the building to specialist physician accommodation combined with the county's announcement of additional spaces for school-age children at the Jean Hamlyn Centre that has had some parents wondering when the hospital board began considering the renovations.

Neither the current president/CEO, Cholly Boland, nor his predecessor, Bob Baynham, could be reached for comment. Mr. Boland is on vacation until next week.

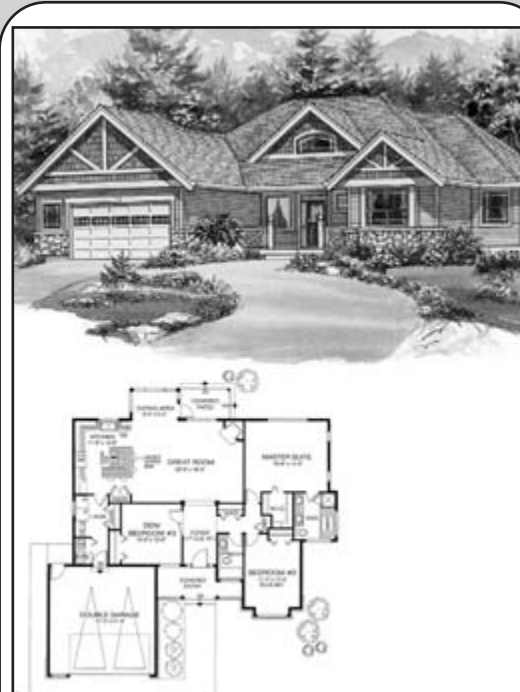

PLAN NUMBER 5-3-636 OPEN-PLAN DESIGN

This spacious, open-plan design could offer the ideal layout for empty-nesters who want to scale down from a large family home but are not ready to move to an apartment. Although there is no basement, an extra bedroom ensures a comfortable place for the grandchildren and other guests to stay overnight. Entry is through a small covered porch, a boon in inclement weather. From the front door, which opens into a generous foyer, there is a view into the great room at the heart of the home. To one side of the foyer is a good-sized den, which could double as a third bedroom. This room might also serve as a sewing or hobby room. On the other side of the foyer is a three-piece bathroom and a coat cupboard, with a passage between the two that leads to the sleeping wing. The great room, a spectacular space that any homeowner will appreciate, features a corner fireplace that will cast its warmth into the dining area and kitchen. The dining area is set into a bay overlooking the back garden - a delightful spot to enjoy casual meals and quite large enough to accommodate dinner guests. A door from the dining area opens to a covered patio, the ideal location for outdoor meals. The good-sized kitchen has plenty of counter space, a double-door pantry and a central island that includes a cooktop and a raised eating bar. The second bedroom at the front of the home features a bay window that could accommodate a window seat. A three-piece bathroom is nearby. The double garage, which provides entry to the house through the utility and laundry rooms, will also serve as a mud room. The garage has access to the kitchen, as well, making it easy to unload groceries from the car. Exterior finishes include horizontal siding, twin pillars that demarcate the entrance, stone accents and decorative wooden bracing in two of the gable ends. This home measures 58 feet, 4 inches wide, and 57 feet, 10 inches deep, for a total of 1,696 square feet of living space.
