Developer wants more houses in Mono subdivision

A public meeting in Mono Tuesday night concerning a controversial new subdivision near Island Lake was told that the developer, Pine Glen Farms, wants to add 17 new lots to the 323 it already planned.

Called Island Lake Phase 3, the subdivision is to be built between First and Second Lines east of Hurontario Street north of Highway 9.

At a June 23 meeting, Mono council had given its approval to the 323-home plan with the provision that it meets the list of 59 conditions set out by

town planning director Mark Early.

The bid for the additional lots drew the rancor from several in attendance who felt the number of approved homes was already excessive.

"Each meeting we have, we hear the number of houses seems to grow," said Mono resident Brian Rasmussen. "Just because you can do something, it doesn't make it the right thing to do. This looks like arrogance on the part of the developer."

"My question is 'where will it stop?' How will we know?"

Pine Glen Farms wants to incorporate the lots into 4.65 acres it recently pur-

chased south of the 170 acres originally acquired for the development that had been given conditional approval.

The purchase allows for plans to extend French Drive to First Line and lessen traffic on a potentially hazardous S-turn farther north on First Line.

Glenn Schnarr, a consultant for Pine Glen Farms on the project, assured those present that the developer has no intention of adding more homes. He pointed out that Greenbelt regulations set forth by both the province and the municipality would make such an addition prohibitive.

It was also pointed out at the meeting that the development would accommodate the population density targets for Mono outlined in the province's Places to Grow plan.

Councillor Jean Castel, who had previously spoken out against the number of homes planned for the development, said he would vote against any motion to approve the additional building lots.

"The issue here is not Places to Grow," said Mr. Castel.

"It's whether the people of Island Lake want these new houses ... and they obviously don't."

(The existing Island Lake subdivision has

lower density, with much larger lots than those planned by Pine Glen.)

A champion of austerity since he was elected to council, Mr. Castel raised a few eyebrows when he presented what he termed "a revolutionary idea" to solve the problem.

Admitting it went against his grain as a fiscal conservative, he suggested the town purchase the 4.65 acres from the developer, turn it into parkland and recoup the money through "assessments."

"Oh sure, Jean," said Mayor Lorie Haddock incredulously, "if you can raise the million dollars it would take and raise taxes

to pay for it, when you've been campaigning against raising taxes for the last three years."

Mr. Castel shrugged and answered: "Well, I did say it was a revolutionary idea."

The plan for the additional lots called for residential as well as commercial building lots, including locating a day care centre in an older home on the property purchased.

While supporting the concept of a day care, councillors thought other commercial space was unnecessary since there are retail outlets in a reasonable proximity that residents could access.

3 Terry Fox Runs this Sunday

The 29th Annual Terry Fox Run for Cancer Research will take place this Sunday, September 13, and again this year, Dufferin County will have runs in Orangeville, Shelburne and Grand Valley.

For the previous 28 years, hundreds of Dufferin residents have turned up annually for the runs and in the process raised more than \$400,000 to aid the ongoing fight against cancer.

This year, the weather is expected to be ideal for the runs, the forecast calling for a mix of sun and clouds and a high temperature of about 20° C.

Last year, despite the threat of downpours and high winds from the remnants of Hurricane Ike, 145 took part in the

Orangeville run and raised another \$10,784 with the assistance of many volunteers and support from Watermaker, Zehrs, Metro, Sobey's Price Chopper, No Frills, Dods & McNair and Orangeville Window and Doors.

The Orangeville Run site will be similar to those in past years, with the start and finish this year at the Jean Hamlyn Day Care Centre on McCarthy Street.

Mark Whitcombe, organizer of the Orangeville run, said the 10 km and 5 km courses will be open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and will both be accessible to runners, walkers, cyclists, in-line skaters and wheelchairs.

Mr. Whitcombe said the 10 km run will include Clara, Centre and Hillside Streets, Centennial Road, C Line, Townline, and take the participants back through town past Orangeville District Secondary School.

He said the 5 km route will take the participants via Parkview, Lawrence, Madison and Centre St.

A limited number of the 2009 Terry Fox Run T-shirts will be available @ \$17 for adult sizes and \$15 for children's sizes.

Pledge forms are available at several locations including Scotiabank, TD-Canada Trust branches, Bank of Montreal, LCBO, grocery stores, Watermaker, BookLore, Moccaberry, medical offices, Sanderson Sports and Esso gas stations. Alternatively, you can access an online pledge sheet at www.terryfoxrun.org.

Mr. Whitcombe said he hopes to have at least as many volunteers as the 45 who turned up last year. Those interested in volunteering can reach him at 519-941-9966.

In Shelburne, plans for the run were on hold until last Thursday, when Joan Wallace agreed to take on the thankless task of organizer.

Since then she has obtained the promise of help from her employer, the local Royal Bank branch, Pete's Donuts and several volunteers, but would greatly appreciate more area residents volunteering by calling 519-925-5221 and, if necessary, leaving a message.

Shelburne's 10k and 5k runs, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, both start and finish at the curling club on O'Flynn Street. Both routes take participants along William, Robert, Park, Fiddle Park and Greenwood streets. From there, the 5k participants will go west on Main Street, right on Gordon, right on Fourth Ave. and

left on Owen Sound Street.

The 10k route goes east along Main to Simon Street, left along Old School Road, right on Dufferin Road 11 to Victoria Street, up to Main, left to Gordon, left along Fourth past the high school, along Cedar Street, Birch Grove and Cedar, Marie to the laneway through to Fourth, left to Owen Sound Street and back to the starting point.

At Grand Valley, the

run starts at the Community Centre, taking place from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Participants will head south on Main to Amaranth, west along Leeson to the trail, and west as far as the first sideroad. That completes a 5 k run, and those wishing to do 10k just follow the same route back to the community centre.
