### ANNUAL HYDRANT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

From September 14th to the end of November 2009, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, Water Works Staff will be flushing fire hydrants and conducting flow tests as part of a regular hydrant maintenance program.
