I am also not talking about the 'life of the party' sort of person, or the person who makes us laugh or who can say the right thing at the right time, although the people I'm talking about may have one or more of these

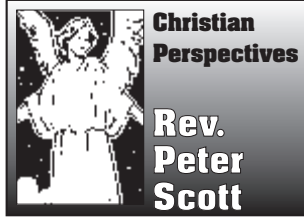
qualities. What I am talking about is something about them that can't be described, or pointed to, we just know it is there. And the result of that gift that they have is what is most important: they bring out the best in us.

would think that the approving authorities (all Provincial ministries) would look at the plan put forward with an extra measure of caution before allowing it to proceed.

The reporter who wrote on the event last week mentioned three times that the quarry plan "must be consistent with the policies of the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS)". It is odd to me that he did not report also that a section of the PPS, section

2.5.4.1a (read out loud by Carol Neumann, OMFRA) states:

"On these prime agricultural lands, complete agricultural rehabilitation is not required if: a. there is substantial quantity of mineral aggregate resources below the water table warranting extraction, or the depth of planned extraction in a quarry make restoration of pre-extraction agricultural capability unfeasible; "

The success of The Highland Companies quarry application does

not hinge upon demonstrating a successful rehabilitation.

The Highland Companies knew this long ago.

I would suggest that the proposed rehabilitation is an appeasement, and that the current agricultural operation in general is a beach-head intended to secure access to the billions of dollars that sit waiting below that Class 1 soil that the PPS considers expendable.
