ANNUAL HYDRANT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM



Until the end of November 2009, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, Water Works Staff will be flushing fire hydrants and conducting flow tests as part of a regular hydrant maintenance program.

Due to sedimentation, this flushing may cause discoloration, so please check your cold water supply before using. If discoloration does occur, let the cold water run until it is clear.

Users are also reminded that Water Works Staff will continue to regularly flush hydrants in some areas in Town on subsequent Wednesdays as part of its regular maintenance program. Again, the water should be checked for discoloration before using it on those days.

The Town appreciates your co-operation and understanding during the hydrant flushing program.

Monthly Payment Plan for Property Taxes for 2010 Taxation Year

The Town of Orangeville offers a monthly payment plan for property taxes.

The monthly equal payment will commence the first Friday of January 2010 and will continue each month up to and including the first Friday of October 2010. The payment amount will be based on one tenth of your total 2009 taxes. A twelve month plan is also available (call for details) starting November 2009. In order to qualify for this plan all taxes must be paid in full.

An application form must be filled out and returned to the Treasury Department by November 13th, 2009 along with a voided cheque.

Sidewalk and Road Winter Control

In preparation for the plowing of sidewalks for the upcoming winter season, you are advised to remove any obstructions/features that are close to the sidewalk. This includes ensuring that any driveway curbing, fences, posts, hedges, planters, ornaments or any other such features are removed or relocated to provide a clearance of at least 12 inches from the edge of the sidewalk towards your house and at least 24 inches from the edge of the sidewalk towards the road.

In addition to the above, in preparation for the plowing of roads for the upcoming winter season, you are advised to remove any obstructions within four (4) feet from the curb or the roadside towards your house. This is essential for snow removal operations. The aforementioned actions must take place before November 15, 2009 and are necessary to prevent damage to private and municipal property, snow removal equipment and injury to operators.

The Town will not be responsible for damage to features in the municipal right-of-way or those that obstruct winter control operations. Please call 519-941-0440 Ext. 2222 or Ext. 2292 for further information.
